Administrator Report

March 18, 2020

Census 2020

The Senior Center Network and Commission on Aging are working collaboratively to assure all seniors in our community are counted. Ads will be placed in various print publications. Print flyers are being distributed throughout the community. We will be working with BATA to have signs on the buses. Important talking points include: Bags will be left on the door of each household in Grand Traverse County in March - the bags will have the paper census form and instructions for completing it by paper, phone or online. Households that do not respond, will be further contacted by mail or in person. The form has nine questions and is expected to take less than 10 minutes to complete, depending on the size of the household. All information collected is kept confidential and can not be used against us in any way. Those who reside in Michigan for at least six months out of the year are being asked to use their Michigan address when completing the census to assure an accurate count in Michigan. All Senior Center locations will be available to assist citizens with online registration if needed. Count day is April 1st and the census bureau will be collecting counts through July.
