



### **Marihuana Revenue Funds Application FAQs:**

Q: Can an organization submit applications for more than one project?

A: Yes

Q: Our organization serves multiple counties. Are we eligible?

A: If your organization can demonstrate that it serves residents in Grand Traverse County, then yes you are eligible.

Q: Can I save my application and go back to it later to finish?

A: DocuSign should allow you to return to your document until you sign and submit it.

Q: Can I prepare my responses in advance or on behalf of another person in my organization for them to sign?

A: Yes. Use the Preview Application Form on the website to prepare your answers – it is identical to the Online Application Form.

Q: Do projects need to be completed in a certain timeframe?

A: Ideally, funds will be awarded to projects occurring in FY26, though other options are possible. Applicants are encouraged to include more details about anticipated timelines in the project description for the Funds Workgroup consideration. Specific details will be provided in a funding agreement.

Q: Is it possible to be awarded less than the amount requested in our application?

A: It is possible. If the requests that come in are greater than the amount of funds available, the Funds Workgroup may recommend to the Board of Commissioners to approve partial awards. If your project can continue with a lesser award, it would be advantageous to indicate that within your project description for the Workgroup's consideration.

Q: What do you consider county funds and public funds regarding whether we've received any before?

A: If you have had any funding agreements or contracts with Grand Traverse County of any kind, those are considered County funds. Public funds are similar and include funds from other local units of governments (County, City, Village or Township,) as well as funds from State and Federal agencies.
